Once activated, customers can log into an online Customer Center to centrally manage up to 100% of their Internet-connected PC assets from a single user interface. In the event a

computer is stolen or goes missing, Absolute can help recover it or remotely delete data to ensure that sensitive information is not exposed to computer criminals.²
